To celebrate the 400th anniversary of the publication of Part II of Miguel de Cervantes's *Don Quixote de La Mancha*, first published in 1615, Prof. Gómez will connect our recent discussions at Knox College concerning diversity and inclusivity to Cervantes's greatest contribution to world literature. By examining how Cervantes represents people that were considered "Other" in 17th century Spain, such as Jews, Muslims, and women, he will show how Don Quixote fits into these conversations and what the 21st-century reader can learn about creating a more inclusive society from it.
